Parish Council Report December 2025

NOTICE OF VACANCY on Plumpton Parish Council

Pocket Park

The Parish Council would like to inform residents that work will soon be taking place in the Pocket Park (the area west of the allotments). While the area has largely been left to develop naturally for the benefit of wildlife, a recent inspection has identified the presence of Ash Dieback on several ash trees. This disease causes trees to become brittle and unstable, creating a potential safety hazard in a public space. As the Pocket Park is a Parish Council-owned amenity, there is a responsibility to manage these risks and ensure the area remains safe and accessible. In the coming weeks, the site will be professionally surveyed, and any trees identified as dangerous will be felled.

We recognise that the loss of ash trees threatens biodiversity, as many insects, birds, and plants depend on them for habitat. Moving forward the ReNature Plumpton project team are looking at strategies to monitor the wildlife and restore loss of habitat and the team will soon begin removal of an invasive species of rose to help restore balance to the park's natural environment.

Nolands Site

We would like to thank all residents for their vigilance and continued reporting of issues relating to lorry movements to and from the Nolands development site. The council appreciate your concern for safety, particularly around school times, and understand the disruption caused when Station Road is blocked. Please be assured that we are fully aware of the situation and have been in regular contact with the developers, Elivia, to address these matters. While it is recognised that not all incidents are directly the responsibility of the developers, they do have a clear duty to manage delivery traffic appropriately, and we will continue to work with them to ensure that routes and timings are better controlled for the safety and wellbeing of the community.

Yellow Developer Signs

The Parish Council has contacted East Sussex Highways regarding the growing number of yellow developer notices being attached to existing traffic signs within the Parish. We are pleased to confirm that action has now been taken and the unlicensed signs have been removed. If you notice any signage fixed to road traffic signs that appears out of place, please do report it — ESCC will review it and confirm whether it has the proper licence. Residents should also be aware that any sign displaying only the developer's name is considered commercial advertising, which is not permitted. Such signs will not be licensed and should be reported to ESCC Highways.

Please note the date of the next Parish Council meeting is December 9th, 19:45hrs in the Village Hall. Members of the public are welcome to attend.

PARISH COUNCIL

With the leaves now nearly off the trees as we move from Autumn to Winter and with the bonfire season behind us, it's the festive time of year again as we get ready for Christmas. At this time of year, it's good to reflect all that has happened in the Parish over the last twelve months or so.

We've had our annual litter pick in March, once again keeping the verges around the parish as tidy as possible. Sadly, walking around the roads recently, it's clear that the litter is building up again despite our best efforts. We've installed a dog waste bin near Hollycroft to encourage dog walkers to keep the footpaths free of dog waste.

Earlier in the year, after months of badgering the folks at Highways, we managed to get them to put new road signs at the end of Honeypot Lane, and since then we have had no more cars ending up in the hedge across the junction with Novington Lane. It's extraordinary to think we had around eight cars in the hedge before the signs were put in place.

After much discussion, we've managed to get essential work done on our church, which hopefully by the time of publication, means it will be safe to use again. Discussions will continue as to how the church might be used to the benefit of the community and of course, funded.

Again, numerous discussions with Lewes District Council through our district councillor, will hopefully result in properly place flooding depth indicators around the areas where the river floods after heavy rains. It happens every year so it would be helpful to have an accurate indication of the depth of water.

The Monday Group have continued their work at keeping our footpaths, stiles, and gateways in good order making country walks through the Parish landscape something we can all enjoy - our thanks go to them for the work they do.

Back in July our pirate-themed Summer party

was a great success, and the weather gods were kind to us. A lot of work goes into organising this making it a true community event.

On Planning matters, we have visited, discussed and denied or approved planning proposals throughout the year, always keeping a mindful eye on developments that help the community. North Barnes Eton Town, remains undeliverable as determined by Lewes District Council and we see no reason why this would change. The Local Plan rumbles on slowly, and we are told should be in place around this time next year.

We have had discussions with representatives from the South Downs National Park which we border, as to how access on and off the park could be improved. We have also stressed with them, and they agree, the importance of maintaining the dark skies designation in our area, which of course means any large scale development would likely damage this.

And we work closely with the team at TECT who do so much to protect and enhance the TECT field which they report on separately in this magazine.

Finally, a heartfelt thank you to everyone who has contributed to Parish life this year. We hope you have a Happy Christmas and prosperous New Year and continue to enjoy life in the Parish.

Daniel Stewart-Roberts, District Councillor

I am working with the site managers of the Nolands Development to minimise the amount of lorry traffic on Station Road during the times it is full of schoolchildren and their parents. They do understand residents' concerns and I hope the situation will improve soon. One helpful step, which may already have happened by the time this article appears, is a change to the site entrance layout, so that lorries can turn left into the site. This will eliminate the need for them to turn round at the Riddens Lane junction, which has been a major nuisance as well as a heightened safety risk.

I know that I spend a lot of time publicising LDC consultations. Here is another one: Lewes District Council has launched a public consultation on its proposed new framework for ensuring that residents struggling with council debts are treated fairly, consistently and with compassion. The proposed Fair Debt Policy policy aims to strike a crucial balance between the council's legal duty to collect outstanding debts - such as council tax, rent, housing benefit overpayments, and non-domestic rates (business rates) - and providing effective support to individuals and families facing genuine financial hardship. The consultation is open now and will run until Friday, December 15. You can view the draft policy and share your opinion via the online survey at www.lewes-eastbourne.gov.uk/fair-debt-policy-consultation

You can book to visit on the same day, and up to two weeks in advance.





Save Summer 2026: Plumpton Activity Scheme Seeks Committee Heroes!

After more than 35 years of summer fun, the Plumpton Activity Scheme faces closure. This isn't a funding crisis; it's a volunteer crisis. Without new committee members, particularly a new Chair, the scheme will not be able to run activities for your children in the Summer of 2026.

The **Plumpton Activity Scheme (PAS)** has been a vibrant, essential part of our village life for over three decades. Every summer, we provide **affordable, fun, and educational activities** for children aged 5 to 11 at Primary School. It's not just a place for the kids to play; it's a vital, subsidised childcare option that keeps our community thriving.

Our Chairperson is standing down due to personal commitments and to allow fresh talent to take over which aligns to the PAS constitution.

This isn't a luxury role—it's essential. The small committee is now desperately searching for new volunteers to step up, take the lead, and secure the scheme's future. **Without a new Chair and immediate assistance on the committee, we simply cannot organise the 2026 scheme, and it will have to close.**

If the Plumpton Activity Scheme closes, the impact on our village families will be:

- **Loss of Affordable Childcare:** Parents will be left scrambling for alternatives that are often far more expensive or require travel outside of Plumpton.
- **A Staple of Summer Fun Ends:** Our children will lose the local, engaging, and educational sessions that have become a hallmark of their summer holidays.

In the church there are a number of 'events' which seem to tumble out one after the other and, until they have been observed, I cannot turn my attention to Christmas. They are All Saints, All Souls, Remembrance Sunday and the final service in the liturgical year, Christ the King at the end of the month. Having reached the end of November things seem to come to a shuddering stop. Then we are straight into a new church year with the four weeks of Advent running up to Christmas itself. Advent requires that we slow right down.

This is, of course, in complete contrast with what is going on 'outside' of church. There it is all busyness and preparation. But even here, the church has influenced what is done. The last Sunday before Advent has an opening prayer which asks God to 'Stir up the wills of thy faithful people...' This became known as 'stir up Sunday' when traditionally the Christmas pudding was prepared well in advance and left to mature, to be heated (and lit!) on Christmas Day itself.

I have never been a Christmas pudding maker, but my sister is a stickler for traditions. We have an ancient diary dated 1891 passed through the family. In it, in faint copper plate writing, is 'Nanny's recipe' which is dutifully followed even though for years we never knew quite what 'brown ale' was and generally chucked in Guinness going by the colour rather than flavour. There follows the 'great stirring ceremony' (compulsory for anyone present) and the obligatory wish for the coming year. The small people put in money - carefully sterilised and wrapped in aluminium foil - no food poisoning ever reported although and much cheating reported by those taking a slice. Tragically this is now a dying custom, so few use coins. Back in the day, my father-in-law used to amuse the children by pretending to choke on an American Express credit card.

Back to Advent and the purposeful 'slow down'. The colour in the church changes to penitential purple, we have no flowers, and the hymns are reflective in tone. There is a sense of anticipation, a waiting, marked only by the growing number of candles on the Advent wreath as we count down the Sundays. For

four weeks the church seems to hold its breath despite all the increasing excitement.

C S Lewis captured this in his poem *The Turn of the Tide*. He pictures a 'deathly stillness' spreading from Bethlehem to Jerusalem to 'the islands of the North'. To Rome to Carthage and the Nile. He imagines the earth sending out a signal to the rest of the cosmos. He captures the moment at which the tide was neither going in nor going out, the moment of stillness before momentous change. Suddenly the tide begins to rush in, life returns and pulsates into space. Heaven dances and 'A shiver of re-birth and deliverance on the earth went gliding.' It is his way of saying that here, in this event, the birth of Jesus, something decisive has happened to the constitution of the cosmos. This is the hiatus of history and the turning point of time.

Breathless was the air over Bethlehem. Black and bare
Were the fields; hard as granite the clods;
...And the deathly stillness spread from
Bethlehem. It was shed
Wider each moment on the land...
So it ran about the girth of the planet. From the
Earth
A signal, a warning, went out
And away behind the air. Her neighbours were aware
Of change. They were troubled with a doubt...
...Then pulsing into space with delicate, dulcet
pace
Came a music, infinitely small
And clear. But it swelled and drew nearer and held
All worlds in the sharpness of its call...
A shiver of re-birth and deliverance on the Earth
Went gliding. Her bonds were released.
Into broken light a breeze rippled and woke the
seas,
In the forest it startled every beast...
So death lay in arrest. But at Bethlehem the
bless'd
Nothing greater could be heard
Than a dry wind in the thorn, the cry of the One
new-born,
And cattle in stall as they stirred.

Beeline to Success

An exciting new wildlife project was reported by Alex Waterfield, Grounds and Garden Manager at Plumpton College.

Alex reported as follows: "*Plumpton College secured a grant from the South Downs National Park Trust to create a BeeLine, wildlife corridor running through the College on an east – west axis, with spurs to the north and south along the route. The BeeLine is almost a kilometre in length, meaning the project will have impact on a landscape scale, connecting with other landowners in the ReNature Plumpton area.*"

Alex sent an invitation to the village "If you'd like to join the activity, you'll be involved in preparing the ground and then sowing a seed mix containing native species of perennial flowers and grasses to support pollinating insects throughout the year, so as with the tree planting project earlier in the year, it would be great to have you join us."

So, on 30th October, a dozen volunteers helped to create a new wildflower corridor from the front of the College to the front of St Michael Church. We look forward to watching the flowers growing next Summer!

TECT Field Fencing Update

The fencing has been fully installed through the field and we are so grateful to all who worked to put it up so quickly. There was also a wonderfully successful turnout with over 40 lovely people helping to plant an amazing 260 trees into the new hedge! All of these trees have been grown from seeds collected locally.

We hope to have some livestock grazing on the field sometime this winter and will inform everyone of dates when we know.

Ecology Walk & Talk

We had a brilliant afternoon on our *Ecology Walk & Talk* on 9th November with freelance Ecologist and Knepp Guide Tom Forward. We saw over 35 different species of birds in and around the field, many of which are on the conservation concern list. Examples included the grey wagtail, meadow pipit & the kestrel - so this is very encouraging! Tom left everyone with lots of ideas of how to work with the land to promote biological diversity.

The TECT committee will be arranging some work days in the coming months to carry out work, such as coppicing the willow trees & tidying the orchard. Details will follow.

TECT Tree Survey Work

A recent tree survey around the field found that some were in need of attention. Work to remove dead and potentially dangerous trees/branches near to footpaths has already started and will continue over the next few months. An ash has been felled adjacent to the stream and logs from this tree have been used for log pile habitats for small vertebrates, arthropods.

A Footpath Detective's Diary

December 2025

A little bit of Ilkley Moor

It was the very end of October and I was returning from Nepal via Yorkshire, as you do, when I had a chance for a wander in one of my favourite places Ilkley Moor. The colours were very autumnal but it was still quite warm. I parked near Grove Road to the west of the town centre but this walk could be equally well accessed from the station. This walk is about 6.5 miles.

I worked my way up in a southerly direction through residential roads and small steep footpaths until I was on the northern edge of the Moor and a path marked on some maps as the Millennium Way. I turned east and followed this well established track towards White Wells, crossing Willy Hall's Spout along the way. The name makes me laugh but it's just a small stream that tumbles off the moor making a little waterfall. White Wells cottages are a collection of connected whitewashed buildings on the north side of the moor above Ilkley. Outside stands a signpost helpfully showing the directions North, South, East, and West in typical plain straightforward Yorkshire style. In around 1700, at the back of Spa Cottage landowner Peter Middleton opened an openair spa bath for the use of the people of Ilkley. In 1791, Robert Dale built two baths on the current site, enclosed by walls on three sides but not roofed over. What remains now within one of the buildings is a plunge pool that is sometimes open to the public including on New Year's Day. The water is COLD!

I passed around the back of the buildings and up a few steps to join the Dales Way Link path in a SE direction and up to nearby Ilkley Crags a smallish outcrop of millstone grit rock. At this point the Dales Way heads east toward the larger outcrop of Cow and Calf but I opt for the Dales Way Link that turns south. I followed that path onto the higher part of the moor as far as the Twelve Apostles a stone circle dating from the Bronze Age. The stones are only

about two foot above the ground. They sit where Ilkley Moor and Burley Moor abut. To continue south on the path would have taken me onto Bingley Moor, too far on this occasion so I turned west on a clear path over White Crag Moss and to the high point of Ilkley Moor at 402 metres. The view to the northeast includes the white 'golf balls' on Menwith Hill, an RAF station, and to the northwest the beautiful Yorkshire Dales.

I continued west on the path to Whetstone Gate where Ilkley Road comes up from Riddlesden and East and West Morton in Airedale. East Morton is where my ancestors farmed and back then in the 15th and 16th centuries Ilkley was their parish church so they would have had to walk over the two moors for marriages and burials. At Whetstone Gate I turned north to follow the track known as Keighley Road passing Cowper's Cross a large stone cross that is thought to have been erected in the 15th or 16th century. Close by is The Badger stone said to be the site of pagan spring equinox gatherings.

Ilkley Moor has been a place frequented by humans for very many centuries and the grit stones bare the markings from ancient times including the cup and ring carvings from Neolithic or Bronze Age and the Swastika mark of similar era. It's a swirling design with a dot or 'cup' in each loop. I saw swastika designs in Nepal and learnt that they have an ancient and much more peaceful significance than what we tend to associate it with following the appropriation of it by the Nazi party in the 20th century.

I followed the track NNE to head back down towards Ilkley seeing a few startled red grouse enroute but not the golden plover, curlew, lapwing, ring ouzel, short eared owl or merlin that can sometimes be seen on the moor. It is a rich and beautiful habitat and holds a very special place in my heart. As I descend the track becomes tarmac a little before meeting the Millennium Way. I wend my way back through the ginnels and residential roads of Ilkley town where many a refreshment opportunity awaits those that want.

Bird Watch

One of the most interesting aspects of birdwatching is migration. At times mind boggling as to how small birds, weighing just a few grams, can traverse ocean and deserts under their own strength and effort. Migration, the movement of millions of birds to and from different continents twice annually has occurred of as long as there have been birds so that they can get away from parts of the world that, at times of the year are too cold to support a food source. During the summer months, however, in northern regions, with the long hours of daylight, lack of human activity and an abundance of insects, for many species it is a bonanza. Many species that do not breed or spend the winter in Britain, do pass through in spring and autumn. Many use regular places to re-fuel before continuing their journeys.

We can understand how a small bird taking perhaps a couple of hours to cross the Channel can wend its way across the Continent, feeding as it goes. The staggering thought is about those that reach Greenland, needing to cross many hundreds of miles of open sea with nowhere to alight or find food for hours on end. Many navigate by the stars at night and during clear weather. Some years ago, we went to Norway, crossing the North Sea on a big hotel-like ship that devoured the coach. During the afternoon, the sun went in and there was cloud cover. Almost immediately, birds appeared on the ship's rail. A Redstart and three Willow Warblers settled and a few House Martins circled above. As soon as the weather brightened up, they continued their migration. This happens regularly on oil rigs where huge falls of birds come down according to the conditions. How many are lost during their travels no one knows but it is certainly the survival of the fittest.

The interest in Firecrests continues. I will be delighted when one of the local enthusiasts calls me confirming that they have identified one. One problem might be their similarity to the Goldcrest, which people do recognise. However, they are very much alike, and until you see the black line through the eye and white above and below, you may not realise that it is a Firecrest. They are often found together, so scanning through a group could prove to be the answer. Many years ago, the first one I saw was in a wood near Beachy Head and we made a special journey to see it. In those days they were very scarce. In the recently published, excellent Sussex Bird Report, it is estimated that, now, up to a thousand pairs breed in this county. This is not the bird news we are used to, an increase of a population instead of a decline and all achieved by themselves, not introduced.

Not being able to get out as much as I used to, I try to see bird action on the television, not just the excellent wildlife programmes, but incidental observations. It was interesting to see, during a race meeting, gulls following the horses and alighting where their hooves had disturbed the ground, making worms and other food available. As far as I could make out, they were Black-headed Gulls which of course don't have black heads at this time of year and when they do, their heads are brown!!

Once again, we are having unseasonal warm and damp autumnal weather and the rainfall has been light with most of the heavy rain by-passing our corner of England. My local rain recording showed a total rainfall of 5.24 ins in October giving a year total so far of 24.67 in. compared with 36.62 in. at the same point in 2024.

During October and part of November the Exmoor ponies have been grazing the fields next to the commons in order to keep them away from the very abundant crop of acorns on the heathland this mast year. We are very grateful for the continued support of our neighbours, and everyone involved. We are awaiting advice from the conservation grazing experts from the Moorland Mousie Trust who own the ponies, about when to release them back onto the common. You may see them grazing inside an electric fenced enclosure on Red House Common with minimal oak trees as the next stage before their release.

Our November talk was on the Dragonflies of Sussex by Simon Linington. Other activities this Autumn included our annual Fungus Walk with Martin Allison and the final bird walk with Adrian. We spotted some seasonal passing birds such as Canada Geese, Greylag Geese and Egyptian Geese and a Little Egret and a Cormorant. We also enjoyed a talk by Barney Tremaine, Farm Manager at the Cowdray Estate Midhurst, who told us about the Regenerative Farming on the estate and how it includes all aspects of the local flora and fauna and care of the soil.

There is no meeting in December.

Planning Ahead with a Lasting Power of Attorney:

A lasting power of attorney (LPA) ensures that someone you trust can step in to manage your affairs if you become unable to make decisions for yourself.

The first thing to know is that anyone can make an LPA, whatever your age. An LPA lets you appoint a trusted friend or relative to act on your behalf and manage your finances, care, or medical treatment if you ever lose mental capacity. This could happen due to illness, injury, or the side-effects of treatment, impacting your ability to make decisions. Setting up an LPA doesn't mean you expect something to happen - it's just planning ahead.

There are two types: property and financial affairs, and health and welfare. You don't need to make both at once, but you must do it while you still have the mental capacity. Choose who manages your affairs carefully. A property and financial affairs LPA covers things like bank accounts and property, fully or partially. A health and welfare LPA covers care, daily living, and medical decisions - but it can only be used once you lose capacity.

You can make an LPA online at gov.uk. Once completed, send them to the Office of the Public Guardian for registration, which can take around 20 weeks. Once registered, you and your attorney are notified, and the LPA can be used. More information is available on the Citizens Advice website.
