Parish Council Report February 2026

Lewes Local Plan - Consultation

Plumpton Parish Council recently attended a meeting of the Lewes District Association of Local Councils, where Cllr Laurence O'Connor highlighted the importance of engaging with the current Regulation 18 consultation. This stage marks a key point in the process, as the council publishes its draft Local Plan for public comment before it is finalised. The Local Plan will shape planning decisions across the district up to 2042, influencing housing, employment, infrastructure, and environmental protection.

A major issue within the consultation is the clear mismatch between national housing requirements and what the district can realistically deliver. Lewes District Council is seeking to limit the number of new homes in recognition of local constraints. While the government's formula suggests a need for around 15,000 homes by 2042, the council's evidence shows capacity for only 8,570 net new homes.

This 43% reduction is grounded in significant limitations, including the boundaries of the South Downs National Park, the coastline, and other environmental factors.

A strong response from residents will help demonstrate to the Planning Inspector that the draft plan has been robustly tested and genuinely reflects local circumstances. This is especially important given the district council's view that the national housing target is unsuitable for an area as constrained as Lewes. Racecourse: New CEO

We look forward to continuing the close co-operation between the Parish Council and the Racecourse management that was established under Craig's leadership.

Tree Survey

The Parish Council is responsible for three areas of land within the parish, and to the best of our knowledge no formal risk assessment or tree survey has previously been undertaken. We therefore commissioned a comprehensive tree survey, carried out by Arboricultural Planning Consultant SJA, covering the Playing Field, Pocket Park and Village Green. The findings, while not unexpected, indicate that a significant number of trees require work, ranging from the removal of deadwood to full felling.

Please note the date of the next Parish Council meeting is Tuesday February 10th 19:45hrs in the Village Hall. Members of the public are welcome to attend.

The recent consultation for the latest update on the local plan has now been closed. We understand the team at Lewes District Council are on track to get the local plan finished by the end of this year which will highlight its recommendations for new housing in the district. We are assured that as far as any proposals for North Barnes Farm are concerned, nothing has changed - which is that the Council has determined the site is unsuitable for future development.

Rotunda and Playground

The parish council are getting some quotes for repair work on the rotunda in

Hollycroft. We are also planning a cleaning session for the playground which is likely to be a date in April.

A WhatsApp channel for people in East Sussex

The County Council have recently launched an official WhatsApp Channel for East Sussex County Council for local residents to use. It aims to be a good way to share messages with residents which they can trust.

You can find it by scanning QR code (see page 5) on whichever device you normally use WhatsApp.

WhatsApp Channel is completely private - followers' details are not visible to the Council or to other followers, and no personal information is shared. It's also a one-way system – followers cannot reply to Council posts (except with emojis) but they can share messages with other people.

Alternate Weekly Collections for waste start from 9th February, which means that, from then on, your black bag waste will be collected once every two weeks, instead of weekly, with recycling being collected on the same day in the other week. Food waste will continue to be collected weekly. The changes bring Lewes District into line with the rest of East Sussex and much of the country (although some councils only collect black bag waste every three weeks). The Council has tried to learn from the wheelie bin roll out in early 2024. There is a lot of helpful information on the website (<https://www.lewes-eastbourne.gov.uk/AWC>), including how to exchange your 140l waste bin for a bigger (240l) one. There will also be extra Environment First waste team staff available on the helpline (01273 471600) to answer any questions.

One of the reasons for these changes is to encourage an increased take up of the food waste collection service. Having visited the Woodlands Composting Facility at Whitesmith and seen the fantastic compost it produces from the collected food waste for farmers and gardeners, I would really encourage you to sign up for the service if you haven't already.

My efforts to get Highways to fix the deceptive flood depth indicator at the Novington Lane railway bridge seem to have got somewhere with the work now scheduled in the next few weeks. In the meantime, do please take care when it has been raining. There have been several recent incidents of cars being written off after driving into the water. Don't let it happen to you.





'It's just a day like any other, the day I decide,

I will quit smoking, start the diet, live better...

The day I decide to leave. The day I decide to stay.

A day like any other.

I give it meaning, as if it is pregnant with power,

and energy that will impel.

Just a day like any other. Yet are all days the same?

Is it a day like any other ...but not.

It is a new day unique perhaps a hope day.

It can be if I choose which makes it a day like any other.'

Well, how are you getting on with New Year resolutions? Well done if you are still on track. I refuse to make any as I know from years of experience that this whole concept does not work for me. I just end up feeling bad that I have not kept it going for even a month. The hour of fast walking, the avoidance of anything unnecessary and yummy, the two books I will read every week etc.

It's interesting that all of the above are designed to improve things that I lack – a fitness regime, a healthy choice, an improvement in knowledge or keeping up the current trends. There is nothing there about me as a person, me in relationships with others. It is a self-referential improvement programme I have designed for me, to be initiated by me, maintained by me. No surprise then that it peters out after a few weeks, if that. Is that because I simply lack the inner resource and willpower to maintain it? I think not, rather it is because 'life' just gets in the way – it's just how it is. I have read that statistically only around 10 percent of us keep up a New Year's resolution – so I comfort myself with that, which reinforces my dismissal

of the whole idea – or is that a cop out of are we being hard on ourselves because we are simply – human.

Self-improvement is not a new idea; we are not the first to become so fixated on it. I read that Benjamin Franklin decided he lacked certain virtues and listed them and decided to give two weeks to each so that he may acquire them. I understand all went well until it came to 'chastity'.

A better approach is that of Aristotle (yes it goes that far back 342 BC). He proposed the acquisition of virtues, and these do not drop from the sky they have to be practiced and habitualised until they become our character. Courage, generosity, kindness, friendship, honesty, truthfulness etc. Where we lack these we 'put it on', we do it deliberately whether we feel inclined or not. Eventually it becomes second nature. I often liken this to a 'uniform' worn for a job. It can feel like 'just dressing up' when you first put it on but gradually you move into the role it represents. Lots of flaws in that example, but we can get the picture.

Paul, the writer of so many letters to early followers of Jesus, had a lot to say about this process. Just as with the conscious decision we make about which clothes to 'put on' when we get up in the morning or when we go out in the evening – casual or smart – so we have to make a deliberate choices to put on certain character traits and put off others. Putting off bad habits and putting on new ones both require the discipline of consciously deciding again and again to do certain things in certain ways in order to embed desired patterns of behaviour deep within us. Deep within the actual physical structure of our brains just as we learn from contemporary neuroscience.

We often use the phrase 'putting it on' about someone who we think is pretending to be something they are not. It carries the accusation of hypocrisy. The point is, however, that we all have to go through the phase when, if we're going to get anywhere at anything, adopting that action or attitude feels artificial unnatural and fake. But gradually bit by bit the deliberate putting on of these qualities will in fact transform our character at its deepest level until they become second nature.

Such decisions and actions do not have to wait for a New Year.

Our 2026 dates are easy to remember – we are normally open every 2nd Saturday of each month between 10am – 1pm. Our new 2026 posters and flyers with all this year's dates are now available at the Café, so you won't forget!

He developed a great interest in Art especially the French Impressionist and Post-Impressionist paintings and, with his immense wealth, was able to assemble a fabulous collection, including Van Gogh's 'Self portrait with a bandaged ear' and Manet's 'Folies-bergère.'



New Year Plant Hunt

In 2012, a group of botanists set themselves a challenge to head out on New Year's Day and see what they could find in flower. Coordinated by the Botanical Society of Britain and Ireland, the New Year Plant Hunt (NYPH) has now grown to become a popular Citizen Science activity, in which thousands of people take part. The rules are simple – to spend up to 3 hours recording the wild and naturalised (not deliberately planted) plants that you find in flower in a chosen location. The flowers need to actually be open, not just in bud.

My first NYPH was in 2016 and I've taken part every year since, following roughly the same route around Plumpton, Streat and East Chiltington. Over the 10 years I've found a total of 75 different species in flower, the most being 40 in 2021. The only 3 species that I've found every single year are Daisy, Dandelion and Winter Heliotrope. Notable for its vanilla-like scent, Winter Heliotrope was introduced to gardens in 1806, first recorded in the wild in 1835, and has since spread widely. Locally, I first recall seeing it by the lynch gate at East Chiltington churchyard; I now see it along Station Road, on the ridge between the racecourse and Streat, and on the verges of St Helena Lane.

So, to this year's hunt. Cast your minds back to January 2nd, a crisp, cold day, perfect weather for plant hunting. I started in Riddens Wood (aka the Chinese Wood) where I knew I would find Butcher's Broom and Periwinkle in flower.

Surprisingly, a lot of the Holly bushes in the wood were also beginning to flower. I then headed across the fields to Streat Lane and picked up Hogweed and White Dead-nettle along the verges. Then to Streat churchyard, where I found Daisy, Sweet Violet, Smooth Sowthistle, Red

Dead-nettle, Annual Meadow Grass and Primrose. Walking along the ridge towards the racecourse I spotted flowers and fruits of Wild Strawberry and the first glorious yellow Lesser Celandine of the year. Then to Ashurst Organics, where Pete and Collette kindly allowed me to look over their vegetable fields. As an organic farm, no herbicides are used. As a result, arable plant species that are in decline elsewhere are thriving. Among other species, I saw Treacle Mustard and Corn Spurrey, both on the Sussex Rare Plants Register.

I continued along the ridge towards East Chiltington churchyard. Our local churchyards represent some of the very few remaining examples of agriculturally unimproved meadows in the parishes and are managed sensitively for wildlife and visitors. I found Smooth Hawksbeard, Red Campion, Petty Spurge and Winter Heliotrope. On across the TECT field, where I found the first Dandelions of the day, and back across the fields to Plumpton Green. The final stop of the day was Plumpton Station. I found Hedge Bedstraw still in flower in the wildflower verge beside Platform 1, and a Forget-me-not, a Bittercress and Annual Mercury in flower at the edge of the car park. The 3-hour time limit was up and I'd found a total of 37 species, one fewer than last year.

Nationally, more than 3600 people took part over the period of 1st – 4th January. 663 different species were recorded in flower, with the highest number, 110, being recorded in Swanage. This is a coastal, relatively mild, location where you would expect to find more species. In contrast, people searching in frosty Scottish glens recorded only Gorse. Urban areas tended to have more non-native species in flower than in rural locations. Towns and cities have more sheltered and disturbed locations, creating warm microclimates where alien plants can establish and naturalise.

The range of species recorded were very similar to previous years. The most frequently spotted species were Daisy, Dandelion and Groundsel. Herb-robert and Winter Heliotrope entered the Top Twenty list of most-frequently recorded plants, displacing Lesser Celandine and Common Ragwort.



A Footpath Detective's Diary February 2026 A stroll around Ditchling

I took over the responsibility for writing the Footpath Detective's Diary in 2006 and after nearly 20 years I'm finding it hard to come up with new routes that might be sufficiently interesting on a monthly basis. I have to supplement a few foreign adventures and routes outside of Sussex, and I'm never quite sure what the good people of Plumpton and East Chiltington want. If there is anyone out there who thinks they have a route they would like to write about to supplement my offerings then do get in touch with our editor.

This little route of 4.3 miles is a loop that starts and finishes by the village hall in Ditchling. When it has been wet there will be a few muddy bits on this route. I did this wander in early November with a good friend who always enjoys a walk and extols the beauty of the countryside with real enthusiasm and so is a joy to walk with.

We began by heading west over the cross roads and past the church that is dedicated to St Margaret of Antioch. The present building dates from the late 12th century, sited on a sandy knoll overlooking the village. It is built on top of an earlier Saxon church referred to in the Domesday Book. Remains of the Saxon church are to be found in the lower walls of the nave. It is well worth a visit. We turned right to walk past the museum and the village pond, which at the time looked very low in water or perhaps high in silt. There appeared to be little in the way of bird life which was sad, hopefully it was just a quiet day on the pond.

Our route continued up Lodge Lane, a narrow tarmac road for a while until passing the last of the dwellings. Then it becomes a track between bushes and at this point can

get a little muddy for a short way. This bit of the route is on a ridge with views to our left across Keymer and Hassocks. At the end of the path we came to Oldlands Mill, a post mill on a single-storey octagonal roundhouse with four spring sweeps. It is owned, maintained and operated by Oldland Mill Trust. It is likely that a windmill has been here or near this spot since about 1700 and there are records that show that this mill has been on the site at least since 1828 and was working until 1912. It fell into disrepair but has been lovingly and carefully restored to full working order and mills flour for local sale.

At the mill we turned right to head north on Oldlands Lane for a short way, then we turned right again onto a footpath that followed the edge of two fields to sweep around east and then SE to bring us to Orchard Lane and from there onto North End (B2112). We turned right towards Ditchling village and then left onto Dumbrells Court Road. We continued to head east along the track towards Mac's Farm and then took a path on our left to head north. The path we were on is between hedges and then on meeting and crossing a wider track we took a path signed on our right that went east. After a couple of field boundaries the signs turned us south on a field edge but we found no exit at the south end of this field and walked the edge of the field around three sides. The signs ran out and in the NE corner of this field we were by the farm buildings of a farm I knew was accessed from Spatham Lane so we followed its track to the lane. I'll have another go at finding where the actual footpath goes another time but as the light was fading we went south down the lane and at the end turned west back into Ditchling using the paths at the edge of the Lewes Road (B2116). It was time for some refreshments and there are a few good places to enjoy refreshments in the village.

Bird Watch

Just before the turn of the year, we ventured into West Sussex to try to find wild geese that come here for the winter. As it was before the cold weather, we were unfortunate that few had yet arrived. These geese are grazers, usually feeding in water meadows or coastal plains. A few days later, the cold weather to the north, with snow covering their food source, pushed several flocks of over a hundred White-Fronted Geese and a few Tundra Bean geese to this county. We found only the usual feral geese, Canada Geese, Grey Lag Geese and Egyptian Geese, all descended from escaped populations from collections over the past centuries. Having no natural predators, apart from perhaps foxes taking eggs or goslings, they thrived and numbers increased.

The Egyptian Geese are now widespread and breed very early in the year. They often have young by February. They are peculiar-looking birds which have been described as being constructed by a committee that assembled the parts before the members consulted! It appears that they are the favourite prey of the White-tailed Eagles that have been reintroduced and breed in the county. Perhaps, if the introduction had been earlier, there would be fewer Egyptian Geese about.

We did also see two of the three Egret species, but not the most common Little Egret. We found Cattle Egret, with yellow thicker bill and hunched up appearance and the elegant Great White Egret, about the size of a Heron. From there we went see the harriers coming in to roost at the Wildfowl Trust at Arundel. Several Marsh Harriers drifted down the Arun Valley as the light began to fail. When I was young, Marsh Harriers were one of the rarest raptors and in the little Observers Book of Birds, it was stated that only about half a dozen pairs occurred in Britain. Now, with

habitat improvement and protection, that number can be seen in a day and there are several communal roosts of them here in Sussex.

An adult male Hen Harrier had been reported using the same reed bed in which to spend the night. These are magnificent birds, with silver-white bodies and black wing tips, that they attain only as full adults of four years or more. Unfortunately it slunk low and though the younger spotters saw it well, I got only a fleeting glimpse.

As the hours of daylight increase, we have the opportunity to recognise and learn the different bird songs. Song is the way male birds claim a territory and attract a mate and will do so in the same places, regularly. Early in the year, just a few do so, so it gives the opportunity to get to know these before later arrivals cause confusion. Song Thrush with its repetitive notes, are the first. Robins will sing from exposed places. Great Tits with their bicycle pump-like song and the beautiful flute-like notes of the Blackbird will also be early. I hope that any who are compiling a year list of birds in their garden are well under way, particularly as the cold snap may have brought something unusual closer to home.

Another interesting observation, is the number of Chiffchaffs wintering in Britain. These dull-coloured little warblers breed in much of Europe and Scandinavia. Those that breed in this country migrate to the Mediterranean region and West Africa, not crossing the Sahrah. At this time of year, those here will most likely be from more northern populations and are usually found where insects are plentiful, such as water treatment works or sewage farms but may well find their way into our gardens. Over two dozen are reported from one such site in West Sussex. As a number of them have been ringed, the chance of discovering their origin is possible.

After a cold, snowy and frosty start to the year, and the passing through of Storm Goretta with heavy rains, we are all looking forward to the advent of spring and we can already see the days beginning to lengthen.

A good start to the year was a talk from one of the commons neighbours, the artist Sacha Turnbull. Living locally and crossing the commons regularly, she has long been interested in the artistic aspect of the local landscape which she has illustrated in a wide selection of artist impressions. Her enthusiasm and quest for detail showed us a wonderful range of beautiful paintings which she has from both outdoor sittings and in her local studio. It was lovely to see the heathland shown in this way as well as other scenes and still life too.

You may have noticed the effects of ongoing conservation management on the commons clearing swathes of bracken and scrub to restore the open habitats of the heathland. The heaps of flailed bracken may provide habitats for reptiles.

The five Exmoor ponies have been back on Red House Common since mid-December. Careful observations by the pony checkers show that they are foraging on a mixed diet of gorse, bramble, and grasses as well as some acorns which are hopefully less damaging now. During the cold snap in early January, they were given some top up hay. Their owner the Moorland Mousie Trust are confident that they will find adequate forage on the common and that the hay can be phased out. Please do not feed the ponies which can also endanger their health.

We are looking for two more pony

checkers to join the team of volunteers. If you are able to commit to two checks per month on a rota and are interested in supporting the conservation grazing of the commons, please contact the Society on mail@chaileycommons.org.uk.
